

Role of the Political Action Officer

The responsibilities of the Political Action Committee Officer revolve around, but are not limited to, the local political arena. As a spokesperson for the OTBU, the representative is expected to voice opinions and concerns which, in turn, will help shape action undertaken by the Committee. As a member of the Committee, the representative is expected to participate in PAC initiatives and, in general, to report upon and coordinate PAC activities at the OTBU level. At its broadest, the role of the Political Action Committee Officer is to promote excellence in education by ensuring that **Public Education works**.

In order to accomplish the above, the Political Action Committee Officer should be prepared to:

1. Attend scheduled meetings of PAC, approximately seven (7) during the school year.
2. Report regularly to the OTBU Executive and members regarding PAC activities.
3. Assist the OTBU President and Executive in carrying out Federation duties.
4. Support actions initiated by the Provincial Political Action Committee.
5. To provide advice, information and training to District 19 OTBU members regarding matters of political concern that affect Federation members.
6. To support actions initiated by the provincial Communications and Political Action Committee.
7. To promote and advance the causes of OSSTF and District 19 at the Bargaining Unit level.
